

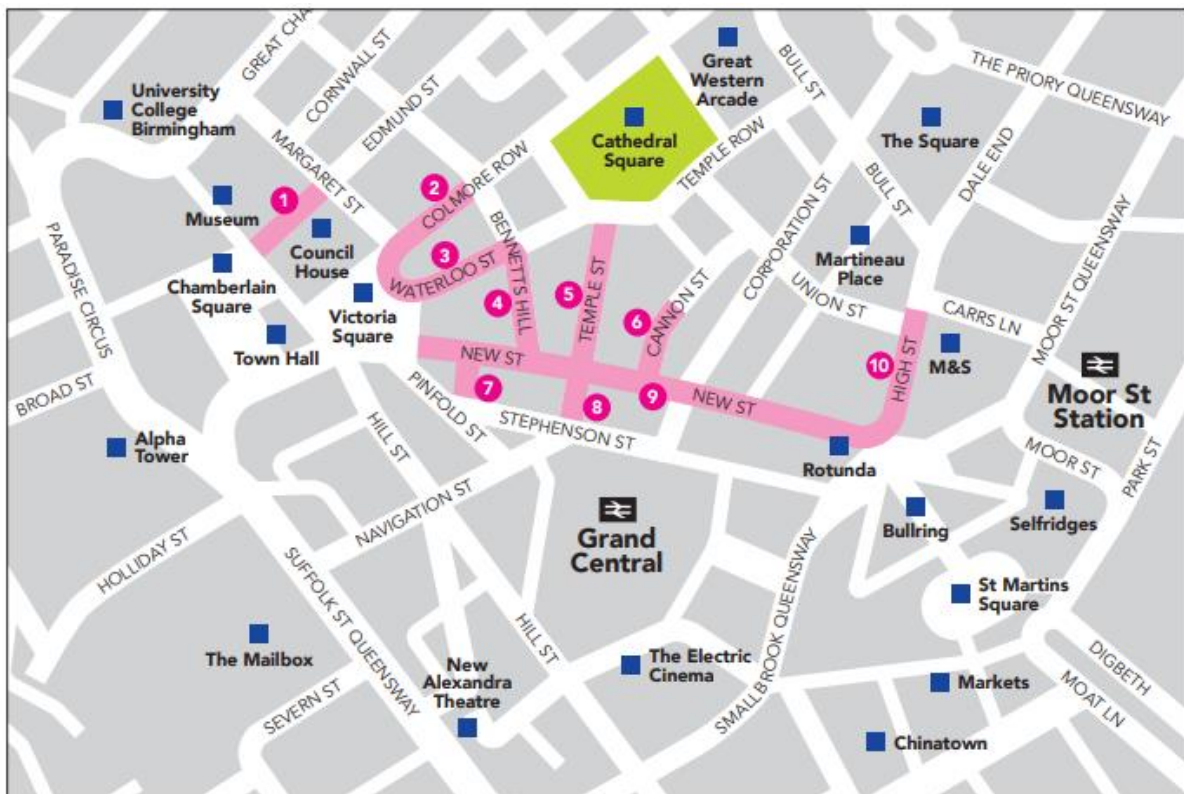

Dear city centre business or resident

Important information regarding restricted delivery times throughout the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games

For the duration of the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games your city centre road will have significant vehicle restrictions in place. Other than Royal Mail letter post, you will not be able to receive deliveries between **7am and midnight from Wednesday 27 July through to Monday 8 August** (inclusive) without the goods being unloaded and transported by foot from outside of the restricted zone.

This map shows the roads where the vehicle delivery restrictions are in place. These are being introduced to ensure that the Games and the associated festival sites and other activities can operate safely for spectators, staff, visitors, businesses and residents. These restrictions have not been implemented lightly, but rather are a reflection of the large numbers of people we expect to be in this particular area and the necessary safety and security arrangements required during the high-profile Commonwealth Games.

With prior agreement from Colmore and Central Business Improvement Districts, and co-ordinated by them, a small number of businesses will be able to receive perishable deliveries between 7am and 9am. Please note this will not be possible on the Saturday 30 July when the Marathon takes place. For the Marathon there will be road closures across the city

centre around the race route from 2.30am through to the 3.30pm on that day and parking restrictions from 6pm on Friday 29 July. See www.birmingham2022.com.

We appreciate the impact of these temporary measures will be frustrating and cause inconvenience and disruption, but we trust that you will be able to plan ahead where needed with your regular suppliers. As the host city we hope businesses in Birmingham can reap the benefits of the city's many visitors over the summer.
